Skinner families, as you may know, the Neighborhood Center is funded through different grants. December Athletics Information

As we enter December, we are in our winter season, hosting Girls and Boys Basketball.

Sports coming up:

- Co-ed Floor Hockey (early spring)
- Girls Soccer (spring)
- Boys Baseball (spring)

As a reminder, here is what students need to participate in athletics:

1. An up-to-date sports physical (are valid for one calendar year)
2. Completed Parent Permission/Emergency Contact Information form (can be picked up and handed in to the main office at Skinner)
3. \$25 pay-to-play participation fee (per sport)

Athletics Eligibility:

Eligibility is based on classwork and homework completion and is determined week to week. If students are missing classwork and/or homework, they are required to complete it in order to participate in athletic games (eligibility does not affect ability to practice with the team). In addition, if a student receives a behavior referral, they will be deemed ineligible for the following week's game, and may face termination for a spot on the team.

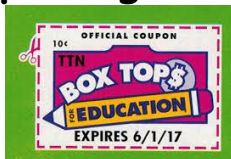
