### Welcome Back!

The Skinner Faculty would like to officially welcome you to the 2017-18 school year! Enrollment is as strong as ever, and we are looking forward to all the excitement this year will bring. We have a new schedule, students have an additional core+ class, and thanks to our families as tax payers, all of our students will be receiving a Chromebook to take home daily. Stay tuned for the different grade level distribution events coming for the Chromebooks. Here is some additional information to get you started on the right foot:

#### Morning Drop Off & Afternoon Pick-up

- **6<sup>th</sup> grade:** 6<sup>th</sup> grade students enter and exit the West door.  
*\*Students dropped off after 7:30am should use the main entrance door.*
- **7<sup>th</sup> Grade:** 7<sup>th</sup> grade families drop off on 40<sup>th</sup> and Julian, also known as the Science Wing Entrance. Please drive west on 40<sup>th</sup> Avenue from Irving, drop off your child curbside and then turn left on Julian Street. Thank you for your cooperation.  
*\*Students dropped off after 7:30am should use the main entrance door.*
- **8<sup>th</sup> grade:** 8<sup>th</sup> grade students enter and exit the main doors. Please do not park on 40<sup>th</sup> in the morning as this is the cause of much of the traffic congestion. Thank you for your cooperation.

Parents should pull up curbside to let students out of the car. Please **DO NOT STOP** in the middle of the street to load/unload as it is unsafe for students and it causes traffic jams. Thank you for your cooperation!

**Breakfast:** Students can eat free breakfast starting at 7:10 in the cafeteria. Please enter through the back west cafeteria door for the morning routine, otherwise students wait on the front lawn until the first bell rings at 7:25am. Students can be dropped at the curb on 41<sup>st</sup>. Please do not pull into the parking lots.

### After School Options

All Skinner Scholars MAKE EVERY MINUTE COUNT! After school time is no exception. The school day ends at 2:45 and after school programming begins at 2:55 pm. *Students should have a clear understanding with families about after school activities and rides.* Students will not be allowed to linger in the halls or on the front lawn as there is no after school supervision unless a student is involved in an organized school activity. Options for after school are:

- Register with the Neighborhood Center and take advantage of tutoring and extra-curricular activities
- Attend Office Hours with grade level teachers (more info about designated days to come at the BBQ on 9/7).
- Get involved with Skinner Athletics (information to come at the BBQ on 9/7).
- Walk home OR get picked up by 3pm

*Parents should be aware that many students walk to McDonald's on 38<sup>th</sup> to wait for their ride. We do not have supervision at McDonald's and the establishment also does not have the staff to monitor middle school students. Skinner provides snacks after school for students who stay for Office Hours / PIE, or who attend the Neighborhood Center. Please talk with your child about making safe choices for after school.*

**\*\*Any student who remains on school property after 3pm will be placed into ASI, where a parent or guardian must sign him/her out**

### Athletics Information

During registration families received information about athletics and the multiple opportunities students have to explore this extra-curricular activity.

#### **As a reminder, here is what students need to participate in athletics:**

1. You must be a 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> grade student.
2. You must be academically eligible for the whole season.
3. You must pay a participation fee when your equipment is issued (\$25/sport).
4. You must have all of the following forms completed and signed by parents:
  - a. Physical
  - b. Parent Permission/Emergency
  - c. Code of conduct
  - d. Financial Responsibility

# High 5 For Skinner

Your involvement in school is crucial. If you are not already involved, it is very important to get involved in the school as a volunteer for a classroom, committee, and/ or school event. We know that students perform better and are more engaged with school when there is active parent involvement. We also know that with the demands of work and running a household, there are different ways that families manage staying involved and engaged with their child's academics and emotional well-being.

Skinner has spent the last four school years developing our system for parent and community involvement and our efforts are paying off! In our first year of promoting volunteering we had documented 5,500 hours of volunteer engagement and we know there were many more hours contributed by our community for the benefit of students.

## What is High 5 for Skinner?

Once again, we are asking that every family contribute at least 5 hours of volunteer / community engagement with Skinner Middle School. This involvement can happen in a variety of ways:

- Attend school events to support your child
- Volunteer in classrooms regularly
- Volunteer for school events occasionally
- Volunteer in the main school building or the Neighborhood Center

## Tracking Hours

Each time you come into Skinner to volunteer, you should sign-in at a designated computer. This helps track your hours that you are contributing to Skinner and your student.

As the year progresses and families hit the 5<sup>th</sup> volunteer hour, names will be displayed. Come see our display grow with all the hands that have given 5 for Skinner! A High 5! As you work your way up in volunteer hours, there are also additional perks! ## Info for Background Check process

To ensure safety for all of our students, Denver Public Schools has a process for volunteers. In many cases, a background check is required. A Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) is posted to the Skinner Website. If you are considering attending a field trip this school year, or getting involved in a way that you would work with students, submitting this paperwork sooner than later is best. Forms can be obtained from the Skinner Website *and must be submitted at the main office or the Neighborhood Center to verify your identity.*

The Lead Volunteer works in collaboration with the principal and is a position that primarily helps coordinate and oversee the logistics of all the volunteer opportunities for Skinner.
