Dear Skinner Middle School Community,

This letter is to provide the Skinner Middle School community with an update on the principal selection process. As you know, Grant Varveris announced he will be departing from Skinner Middle School and the Denver Public Schools at the end of this 19-20 school year. We thank Grant for his valuable contributions, dedication and leadership at Skinner.

DPS considers selecting a new principal as one of the essential components when building highly effective schools. The Collaborative School Committee (CSC) met this evening to start the initial steps of the selection process by reviewing the timeline, next steps for creating a School Principal Selection Advisory Committee (SPSAC), and how we will gather information on what the Skinner community is looking for in their next leader.

With any principal selection committee, there are certain steps we must take to ensure that the committee members and the community-at-large are confident and clear with the process. We will begin steps this week to review the principal selection process with the CSC who will be responsible for recommending a School Principal Selection Advisory Committee (SPSAC). The SPSAC will be comprised of a combination of parents/guardians and staff members who represent the diversity of the Skinner community. The SPSAC will work with us to synthesize the community feedback about the essential characteristics of the next Skinner leader and interview the top 3-5 candidates, and recommend the top 2-3 candidates to participate in subsequent steps of the process to include a Learning Walk and Community Forum.

Skinner highly values the voices of all our stakeholders. To honor this, we would like your input in determining the characteristics you would like to see in the principal. Please note that applications are due by Friday, February 7, 2020 @ 5pm so the CSC can review and select the SPSAC.

Lastly, please see the following timeline of the steps of the process. This is to help you better understand what to expect and what the commitments are should you decide to apply to be a part of this SPSAC.
