How can Skinner Scholars continue their academic and intellectual growth during the Summer?

Why should students continue to access academic resources over the summer?

At Skinner, we want to provide resources to have our students avoid "summer slide." Our students work so hard throughout our school year to make academic gains with their grade level content. What has changed?
